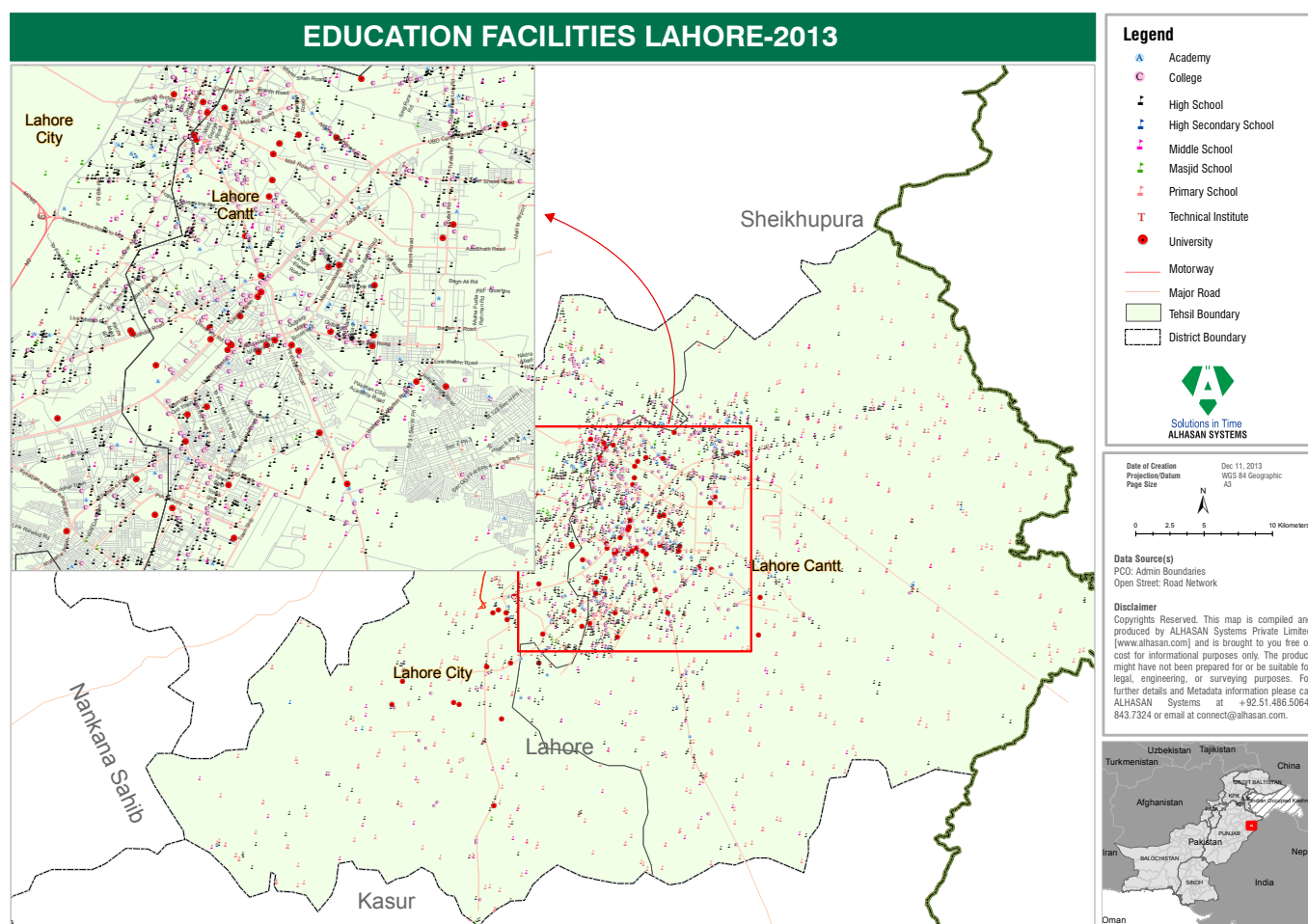

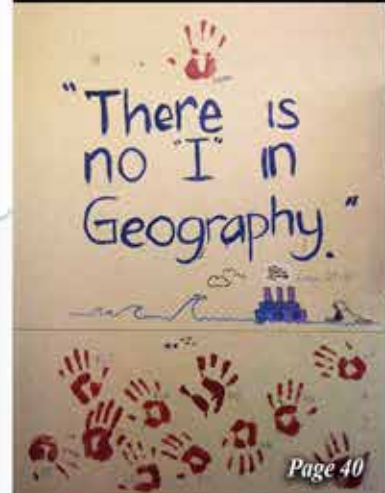

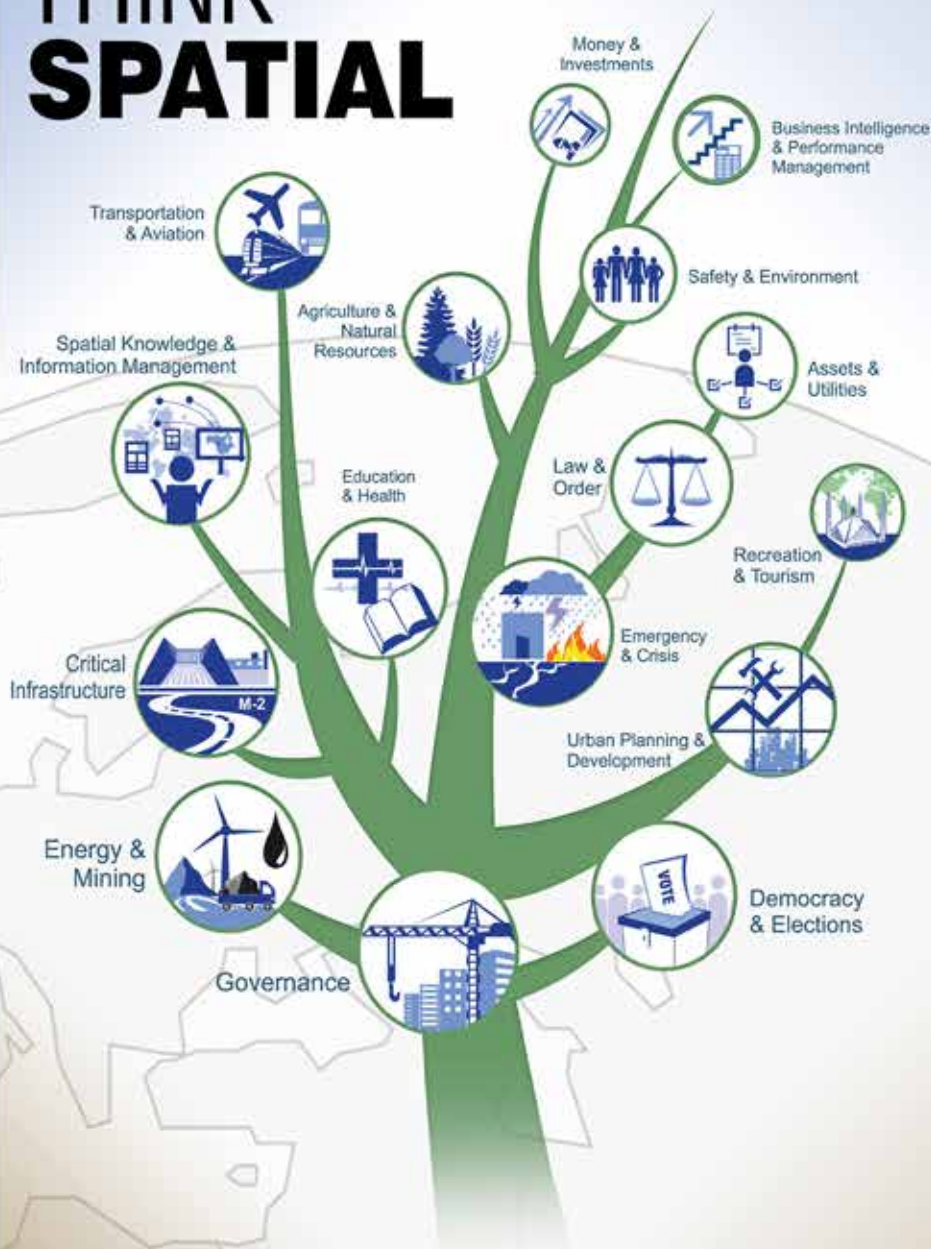

Rs200m succour sent to quake victims: CM

DETAILS

LAHORE: CHIEF Minister Shahbaz Sharif has said that on the instructions of Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif, relief items worth Rs 200 million have been sent to earthquake affectees of Balochistan, while a sum of Rs 350 million has been deposited in the Prime Minister's relief fund.

He was talking to media on the occasion of dispatch of relief items through trucks for the earthquake-affected people of Balochistan under the winter package, here Friday

He said that Punjab Assembly Deputy Speaker Sher Ali Gorchani, MPA Atif Khan Mazari, Senior Member Board of Revenue, DG PDMA and political personalities served the affected the people for which he was grateful to them. He said liaison offices were set up at Karachi and Rahim Yar Khan to monitor relief operation. He said that people of Punjab, on his appeal, donated generously; parliamentarians donated their one month's salary while government officials from Grade 16 to 22 donated their one day's pay towards Prime Minister's Relief Fund.

Replying to questions, Shahbaz Sharif said that Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif had announced an excellent package for the promotion of trade and economic activities which will benefit traders, industrialists and those associated with agriculture sector, besides increasing investment and accelerating economic activities. In reply to another question, he said Prime Minister had made appointment to the posts of Army Chief and Chairman Joint Chiefs of Staff Committee in accordance with the constitution and law and it was expected that all institutions of the country would work for national reconstruction. He said that Pakistan Army, political institutions and all stakeholders would have to strive collectively to counter terrorism and work for economic strength and stability of the country. He said every decision of the government will be in the interest of the country and nation. Regarding prices of essential items, he said relevant departments were making coordinated efforts for stabilising prices of necessary items and their efforts were yielding positive results. He said the flaws in the system were being removed and an effective mechanism had been adopted to control prices. He said though commissioners and DCOs were responsible for the prices stability but the cooperation of police had also been sought for the purpose so that hoarders and profiteers could be brought to justice. He said a plan had been evolved to give a targeted subsidy to the families living below the poverty-line. He said a monthly subsidy of Rs 1,000 would be given to 3 million poor families of the province from January 2014.

EDUCATION: Shahbaz Sharif has said the future of country and nation is linked to the promotion of education, as the country can be put on the road to progress and prosperity by spreading education. He said that Schools Reforms Roadmap yielded positive results and the enrollment campaign for admission of children in the schools was going on successfully and 100 percent enrollment target would be achieved soon.

He was presiding over a high-level meeting to review the Punjab Schools Reforms Roadmap, here, Friday. Special representative of DFID, UK, in Pakistan Sir Michael Barber gave a detailed briefing with regard to Punjab Schools Reforms Roadmap.

Addressing the meeting, Shahbaz Sharif said that due to the steps taken for the uplift of education sector, the target of increasing literacy rate would be achieved. He said that missing facilities were being provided in girls' schools of the province during current financial year, whereas the target of providing missing facilities in schools of all districts of South Punjab, during the current year, had been fixed. He said a formal monitoring system of education sector was being evolved. He said that the attendance of students and teachers in schools would be checked through digital technology. Directing Punjab Information Technology Board to prepare a digital system for monitoring attendance, he said the digital monitoring system should be launched as a pilot project in DG Khan. He said the performance of District Teacher Elevators should be improved and District Teacher Elevators showing poor performance should be removed immediately. He said that performance of teachers in the classroom should also be reviewed. He said that modern teachers training centres should be set up in every division. He said we have to work jointly as a team and take coordinated steps for the promotion of education.

British educationist Sir Michael Barber said that due to the steps taken by the Chief Minister, facilities in the schools had improved considerably.

Charter for minorities' rights presented

LAHORE: The minorities of Pakistan must be given equal rights and opportunities which is imperative to evolve a modern progressive Pakistan as envisioned by Quaid-e-Azam Mohammad Ali Jinnah.

This was said by Romana Bashir, executive director Peace and Development Foundation (PDF) during a press conference at the Lahore Press Club on Friday. Bashir said hate material against minorities, especially in textbooks, must be purged out as it was contributing in widening the gap between faith communities in Pakistan. "Provision of 20 extra marks to Hafiz-e-Quran during exams gives a clear edge to the Muslim students over non-Muslim students for admission in higher classes.

This provision, which is a blatant injustice in education system, needs to be redressed. We suggest eliminating this discrimination that 20 extra marks should be given to non-Muslim students on the basis of certificates provided by their religious institutions.

The criterion for nomination against these reserved seats for minorities should also be altered in a way that the respective communities could have their say in the process of such selections/elections," she added.

Pakistan pushes UNESCO for third biosphere reserve in Gilgit-Baltistan

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Thursday pushed the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) for the country's third biosphere reserve in Pamir, Gilgit-Baltistan.

Minister for Science and Technology Zahid Hamid in a meeting with a UNESCO delegation said that the government has completed documentation for the third reserve. The UNESCO delegation extended its support in soliciting approval for the Karakoram Pamir biosphere reserve, and is expected to be made official during the visit of the DG UNESCO to Pakistan in June, 2014.

Pakistan currently has two biosphere reserves – the Lal Sohanra National Park located in the Cholistan Desert, which was approved by UNESCO in 1977. The second is the Juniper forest of Ziarat, believed to be the second largest of its kind in the world, which was approved in May 2013.

The delegation was also informed that the Ministry was working on the fourth such reserve in the country, which would be located in Sindh.

The UN global development network's programmes in Pakistan, particularly the ongoing Man and Biosphere (MAB) programme which is led by Ministry of Science and Technology through Pakistan Science Foundation (PSF) was also discussed.

Secretary Ministry for Science and Technology Kamran Ali Qureshi, Director UNESCO Islamabad K K Nagata, Chairman Pakistan Science Foundation Khalil Ahmad were also present at the meeting.

The delegation discussed the issue of blind dolphin – endangered species found in Indus River. The Minister directed the PSF Chairman to prepare a project for the protection and preservation of the said dolphins.

The UNESCO delegation said that it will help Pakistan in development projects related to scientific education, health and cultural heritage.

SC directs govt to appoint regular chairman of HEC within 15 days

Supreme Court (SC) has directed government to make appointment of regular chairman of Higher Education Commission (HEC) within 15 days.

The SC further remarked no acting appointment can be made on regular post.

A 3-member bench of SC led by Justice Nasir ul Mulk took up law colleges case for hearing Wednesday here.

The court was told during the course of hearing that 2 names have been presented for appointment of chairman HEC and consultation process is under way in this respect. Imtiaz Hussain Gillani has been appointed as acting chairman at present.

The court expressed displeasure over it remarking "this is a regular post and neither any adhoc appointment can be made against this post nor an acting chairman can be appointed.

HEC and Punjab University Lahore presented two reports in the court with reference to the inspection of law colleges.

Vice chairman Pakistan Bar Council Syed Qalab Hussain told the court he had reviewed these reports and it was said therein Punjab University has completed inspection of 24 law colleges and inspection of 10 law colleges will be conducted soon.

The court was told by Pakistan Bar Council that 3 different rules and regulations were enacted in different years with reference to law colleges. 4 weeks time will be needed to review them.

Justice Nasir ul Mulk remarked "we can not make any compromise on the standard of education of law.

The court remarked "we can not tolerate such long delay on this important matter, therefore we are giving two weeks.

The court directed Pakistan Bar Council to evolve rules and regulations within two weeks and present report thereof before it.

Education is free from class 1 to 10 in all government schools

ISLAMABAD: Education is free from class one to 10th in all government schools within the federal territory, said Director General Federal Directorate of Education Islamabad Dr Shahnaz Riaz.

She stated this while addressing the 4th annual convention titled 'Education-Road to Sustainable Development and Peace' organised by the Pakistan Coalition for Education (PCE) here on Monday.

She said, "By implementing the article 25-A of the constitution the ministry of CAD had directed all the public sector schools not to collect the monthly fee from the children from the next month." While addressing the convention PCE National Coordinator Zehra Arshad demanded of the authorities concerned that they should immediately implement free and compulsory education for all.

She further said, "The PCE is taking important steps for implementation of Article 25-A and have set up a network in more than 65 districts of the country for that purpose." "Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) introduced in 2012 as Right to Free and Compulsory Education and the Sindh government in February 2013 introduced 'Sindh Right of Children to free and Compulsory Education Bill' but still rules of business have not been drafted for either," she added.

"The representatives of the civil society, PCE have filed three Public Interest Litigation suits in the High Courts of Islamabad, Lahore and Peshawar to demand the respective provincial governments to provide free and compulsory education to all children as promised in the Constitution — but the courts aren't giving the cases the attention they deserve," she resented.

Zehra cited that according to Unesco, the number of children out of school is 12.9 million (the second highest number in the world, after Nigeria) adding that only 64% schools have drinking water, three percent of schools have electricity, 61 percent schools have latrines, 13,635 schools in Pakistan (11%) have no building.

According to the Unesco Global Monitoring Report 2012, Pakistani women with a high level of literacy earned 95 per cent more than women with no literacy skills, whereas the differential was

only 33 percent among men.

The others speakers said that the survival rate till grade 5th (number of students who complete school till the fifth grade) is 56 (out of a 100). Only 35% of all primary school teachers in rural areas of Pakistan are female, which will continue to limit access to females, as many families don't feel comfortable sending their daughters to school unless they have female teachers due to cultural norms prevalent in Pakistani society.

ISLAMABAD : British High Commissioner to Pakistan Adam Thomson has said that UK is working in a big way to help Pakistan get more children into schools and train English language teachers.

In an interview to Radio Pakistan, he said that they are heavily engaged with the Punjab and KPK and private sector in Sindh to increase school enrolment.

He said the UK helped Punjab government bring an extra one and a half million children into primary schools during the last three years and is working closely to realise the target of universal primary education in the province by 2018.

The high commissioner said the British Council is working closely and would extend cooperation to KPK and Sindh to train over three hundred thousand teachers of English language.

He said the UK is also helping build twenty thousand class rooms by 2015 in Pakistan. He, however, said it is for Pakistan Government and its people to ensure that militants are not allowed to shut these schools and prevent girls from attending educational institutions.

Gilani vows to take HEC back to past glory

PESHAWAR : The vice chancellors of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa public sector universities met with the Chairman Higher Education Commission (HEC) Engineer Syed Imtiaz H. Gilani here on Thursday. The meeting was held in the backdrop of chairman's decision to reach out and consult all the stockholders of higher education sector throughout the country. Taking advantage of being in Peshawar, the chairman decided to kick off the consultative meetings from here.

Gilani vowed to take the HEC back to the past glory and the vision with which HEC was constituted in 2002 by Prof. Dr Atta-ur-Rehman, ex-chairman HEC, adding, "we still need to see "relevance" as the main yardstick to measure the success and sustainability of universities and education being delivered by our universities. "As a policy we should articulate what we have today and consolidate before we embark upon new development projects," he said, "before opening up new universities haphazardly, HEC will take a look at existing set ups and their degree programs against quality and their need in the current market."

The meeting discussed various issues particularly peculiar security conditions of KPK, thus agreed upon allocating special security funds from HEC for the Vice Chancellors and University Campuses.

The Vice chancellors expressed satisfaction over the decision of Federal Government and assured Gilani that they would raise one voice to make the system work under his leadership.

Gilani also assured the members that HEC will continue its policies favoring universities however, there will be zero tolerance for mal practice in future adding, we want HEC to be back on the road of development and prove it again as a model institution for the world.

Denmark to spend \$50m on education, economic uplift

Ministry of Education and Trainings, in collaboration with National Commission for Human Development (NCHD) has also established more than 0.15 million literacy centres during the last ten years in which 3.2 million students were imparted literacy skills.

According to official sources on Sunday, National Plan of Action has already been launched in September this year in coordination with Provincial and Area Departments of Educations to achieve Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) targets and accelerate efforts towards achieving Universal Primary Education in shortest possible time. Following a multi-stakeholder consultative process, the Ministry and Provincial Departments of Education also jointly organized eight workshops this year to develop Plans of Action. The consultative meetings were attended by Provincial Secretaries of Education, representatives of civil societies, UN agencies, and donors. Provincial Sector Plans were employed as guiding documents for developing Plans of Action.

ISLAMABAD: Denmark will spend \$50 million for programmes focusing on economic and democratic development, education, human rights and gender equality in Pakistan.

Denmark's Minister for Development Cooperation Christian Friis Bach early this month launched the new development programme 2013-16 for Pakistan here.

According to sources, Denmark will almost double its commitment from around \$8 million annually to \$14 million over the next three and half years as a continuation of the first program launched in 2010.

Aid to Pakistan is a small portion of Denmark's overall strategy for Pakistan and is expected to become a catalyst for broader social and economic change, gender equality and transformation in lives of people.

The main objective of the programme is to contribute to improving the lives of poor people and their ability to create a better life for themselves.

The new program consists of two major components.

The first component aims to provide support to peace building, livelihoods and education in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Federally Administered Tribal Areas and Balochistan.

The support will be provided through a Multi Donor Trust Fund (MDTF) with a total budget of \$15 million, which is administered by the World Bank and implemented by the provincial authorities.

The MDTF programme focuses on reconstruction and economic development in the areas bordering Afghanistan and will strengthen the writ of the state.

In addition, \$11 million will be channelled to the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) for early recovery of educational services in the border areas.

The second component focuses on enhanced democratisation, human rights and gender equality.

Approximately \$7 million support will be provided to state building, including statutory bodies in the human rights area and provincial assemblies in their role as duty bearers and \$13 million for civil society organisations as rights holder representatives in the areas of democratisation, human rights and gender equality and \$4 million for strengthening of bilateral ties through people to people partnership programmes.

The Danish development programme framework reflected the strategic choices made to support Pakistan in its democratic transition, especially taking account of the continued conflicts in the north-western border areas.

The Danish development strategy has a rights-based approach and focuses on the underlying power relations and fundamental causes of discrimination and poverty, giving priority to actions aimed at benefiting the poorest.

Denmark is keen to share its expertise in agriculture and energy sectors particularly wind mills and solar energy, with Pakistani entrepreneurs.

Several leading Danish companies are already operating in Pakistan in pharmaceutical and dairy industries.

HYDERABAD: The academic community has vowed to protect the institutes of higher education against the political influences by resisting the provincial government's moves like lessening the universities' autonomy.

Around 200 faculty members from the Mehran University of Engineering and Technology, Sindh University, Sindh Agriculture University and Quaid-e-Awam University gathered at a demonstration at MUET Jamshoro on 11th Nov, 2013.

The protest call was given by the Federation of All Pakistan Universities Academic Staff Association (FAPUASA). The teachers demanded restoration of the universities' autonomy, appointment of academicians in the search committees and the condition of a PhD candidate for appointment of vice-chancellors.

GHALLANAI: All public schools and a college in Safi tehsil of Mohmand Agency will be reopened from November 11 after a gap of five years, and deputation orders of all teachers have been cancelled.

This was decided on Saturday 9th Nov, 2013 during a meeting held between officials of the education department of Mohmand Agency, Pakistan Army and the political administration.

Pakistani education officials say they have banned teenage activist Malala Yousafzai's book from private schools across the country, claiming it does not show enough respect for Islam and calling her a tool of the west.

Malala attracted global attention last year when the Taliban shot her in the head in north-west Pakistan for criticising the group's interpretation of Islam, which limits girls' access to education. Her profile has risen since then, and she released a memoir in October, I Am Malala, co-written with British journalist Christina Lamb.

While Malala has become a hero to many for opposing the Taliban and standing up for girls' education, conspiracy theories have flourished in Pakistan that her shooting was staged to create an icon for the west to embrace.

LAHORE: Punjab Governor Chaudhry Mohammad Sarwar has said the federal and provincial governments valued the support of organisations working for the welfare of poor people.

Addressing a second regional seminar on Corporate Social Responsibility with the theme "Promise of Rural Development and Services Delivery" organised by National Forum for Environmental and Health and a private media group at a local hotel on Friday, the governor said if one was rich and had resources, it was obligatory to think for the betterment of deserving people.

Chaudhry Sarwar said he had told a member of the European parliament that if Pakistan got the generalised scheme of preferences GSP Plus Status, it would be beneficial for the people of Pakistan belonging to different segments of society.

The governor said it was very important to give hope to people as they were suffering from a number of problems and losing hope.

He said the government, NGOs and overseas Pakistanis, if all worked together, could deliver.

He said education was an important tool to bring about change as it was the only way to resolve problems. OGDCL GM Irfan Babar said it was aggressively involved in corporate social responsibility promotion activities. app

UN assures Balochistan govt of quake help

ISLAMABAD: The assurance came from UN Resident Coordinator in Pakistan Timo Pakkala during a meeting with Balochistan Governor Muhammad Khan Achakzai in Quetta on Monday. Mr Pakkala, who is also the humanitarian coordinator for the country team comprising representatives of the UN agencies, briefed the governor about the firm commitment of the United Nations to work with the provincial government in line with the 18th amendment and in the context of 'UN One-Programme'. The delegation shared an update on the main areas of intervention that United Nations agencies planned to focus on in the next five years, including governance, food security, agriculture, health services and education. According to a UN statement in Islamabad, the briefing was part of the continued consultation process between the United Nations and the Balochistan government. The process aims at ensuring appropriate coordination and thorough involvement of relevant stakeholders in both planning and implementation of the development and humanitarian intervention in the province, it says.

Updates on Balochistan Earthquake

UNICEF has planned to cater the emergency education needs of 15,000 children (6000 girls & 9000 boys) through setting up 150 Temporary Learning Centres (TLCs) in the affected areas. This would be done via four implementing partner

Due to funding constraints the Education cluster has reached only 17 % of its target 145,633 children planned in the Humanitarian Operational Plan (HOP).

The cluster has so far reached 24,562 children (girls: 11,737, boys: 12,825). Of the total reached, 13,573 are in three camps and 10,959 in various host communities.

Forty eight (48)Save the Children supported Temporary Learning Centres (TLCs) are operational in host communi-ties of Peshawar Valley where a total of 7,700 children (3,516 girls, 4,184 boys) are studying.

3,250 Other IDP children (1568 girls) displaced from Tirah Valley, are enrolled in 25 government schools of Kohat and Hangu districts and in Kurram Agency of FATA.

During the reporting period, 268 additional displaced chil-dren (236 girls) were enrolled by PADO Implementing partners of UNICEF.

Thirty-nine (39) children displaced from Tirah Valley have been enrolled in government schools of Kurram Agency.

Al-Khidmat Foundation Pakistan intends to raise the number of scholarships for Sindh to more than 300 in 2014 so that more students can be accommodated in getting educational scholarships through AFSS.

For the education and socialization and social welfare of prisoners, computer courses are initiated in Karachi Jails so that the prisoners after being released from the prison may become a productive part of the society. 26 male and 21 female prisoners have participated in the said computer courses in 2013.

In Tharparkar, the residents of the area have no access to electricity, water and gas. Al-Khidmat Foundation Pakistan (AKFP) after realizing such a miserable educational condition of the area initiated "AL-ILAM Secondary Education Project Tharparkar" in 2007. AKFP started 19 Primary Level "Chondra Schools" across the district which laid the foundation of an educated community

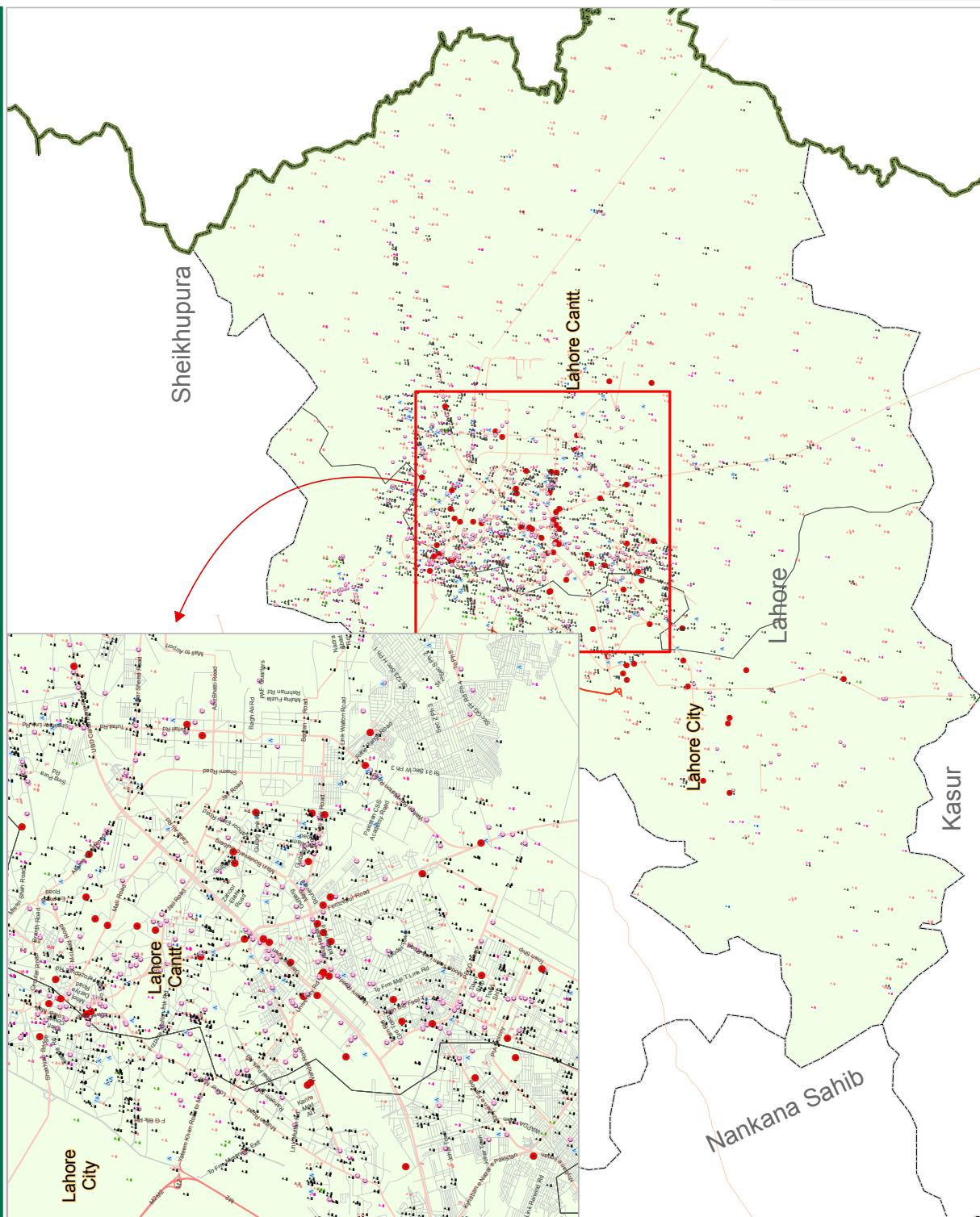

Destroying the HEC

The Higher Education Commission is once again under attack, this time by the government of Sindh. The attacks on the HEC began in September 2008 under the previous PPP government when the scholarships of thousands of students sent abroad by the HEC were stopped, literally forcing many to beg for money. Since most came from poor families, they had no other option.

Appeals to the PPP's leaders were met with no result, forcing me to resign in protest. The powers of the HEC to hold DDWP meetings and approve projects were then withdrawn, and the status of federal secretary for its executive director was also taken away. Its budget was slashed and then a full attack was launched by trying to devolve the HEC to the provinces.

What better way to destroy an organisation than to shred it into pieces? During the last five years I have had to file a petition twice before the Supreme Court to save it from being illegally devolved and transformed into a subordinate body of the Ministry of Education. I was fortunate to win both times. The nation is thankful to our Supreme Court once again for its decisions. However, the attacks continue.

In open defiance of the decision of the Supreme Court of Pakistan, the Sindh government passed a law earlier this year forming a parallel body to the HEC. The 'Sindh HEC' will take over the federal HEC's functions and perform them itself. A formal notification to this effect was issued recently. This is obviously illegal as one cannot have a provincial law overriding a federal law (Article 143 of the constitution). The Supreme Court has already ordered on April 12, 2011 that higher education is a federal subject, and this is fully protected under the 18th Amendment to the constitution, and that its status cannot be changed without a constitutional amendment.

The Constitutional Reform Committee formed in connection with the 18th Amendment had decided that the primary and secondary education issues could be dealt with by the provinces, but since issues relating to higher education are concerned with national integration, cohesion and national development, they must be dealt with at the federal level.

Indeed higher education and research is a federal subject all over the world, including India, Korea, Turkey, China, UK and other countries for this reason. The 18th Amendment through the 4th Schedule (Article 70(4) Federal Legislative Lists Part-I and Part-II) therefore completely protects the current powers and functions of the HEC, and mandates higher education and research to be federal subjects. All the provinces are represented by provincial secretaries or their nominees in the governing body of the HEC so they have a say in all the projects that are approved. The other experts nominated by the prime minister are also selected to ensure a provincial balance. This mechanism thus allows all the provinces to actively participate in the development and implementation of all plans and policies of the HEC.

The establishment of the HEC in October 2008 as an autonomous body run by a 16-member board marked a glorious new chapter in

the history of Pakistan. Under law, the chairman of the HEC has the status of a federal minister while its executive director had a status of a Federal Secretary. The dramatic changes in our universities have been comprehensively reviewed and reported in voluminous documents of the World Bank, the British Council, USAID, the Royal Society (London) and the United Nations Commission on Science Technology and Development.

Six of our universities were ranked among the top 500 universities of the world and two were ranked among the top 300 of the world -- there were none in 2003. Enrolment increased from 270,000 in 2003 to over a million at present, while the number of universities increased from 59 in 2000 to 137 currently. Research output jumped from only about 600 research publications in 2000 to over 8,000 research publications by 2012, and the number of PhDs awarded in the last 10 years was over 5,000 while only 3,500 were produced in the 55 years preceding 2003.

A review of the higher education system of Pakistan was carried out by Prof Michael Rode, chairman of the United Nations Commission on Science, Technology and Development, and professor at the University of Innsbruck in Austria who visited Pakistan on a number of occasions. In a 2008 article he wrote: "Around the world when we discuss the status of higher education in different countries, there is unanimity of opinion that the developing country that has made the most rapid progress internationally in recent years is Pakistan. In no other country has the higher education sector seen such spectacular positive developments as that in Pakistan during the last six years."

The remarkable progress during 2003-2008, which saw unprecedented development of our universities, caused alarm bells to ring loudly at the highest level in India. Detailed presentations were given to the Indian prime minister about the dramatic advances being made by the HEC. This was prominently reported in The Hindustan Times in an article titled 'Pak Threat to Indian Science' (July 23, 2006). The Indians need not have worried. The threat to Pakistan comes not so much from India as from within. We have sunk so low that even ministers of education can be found to have fake school certificates, as well as forged university degrees.

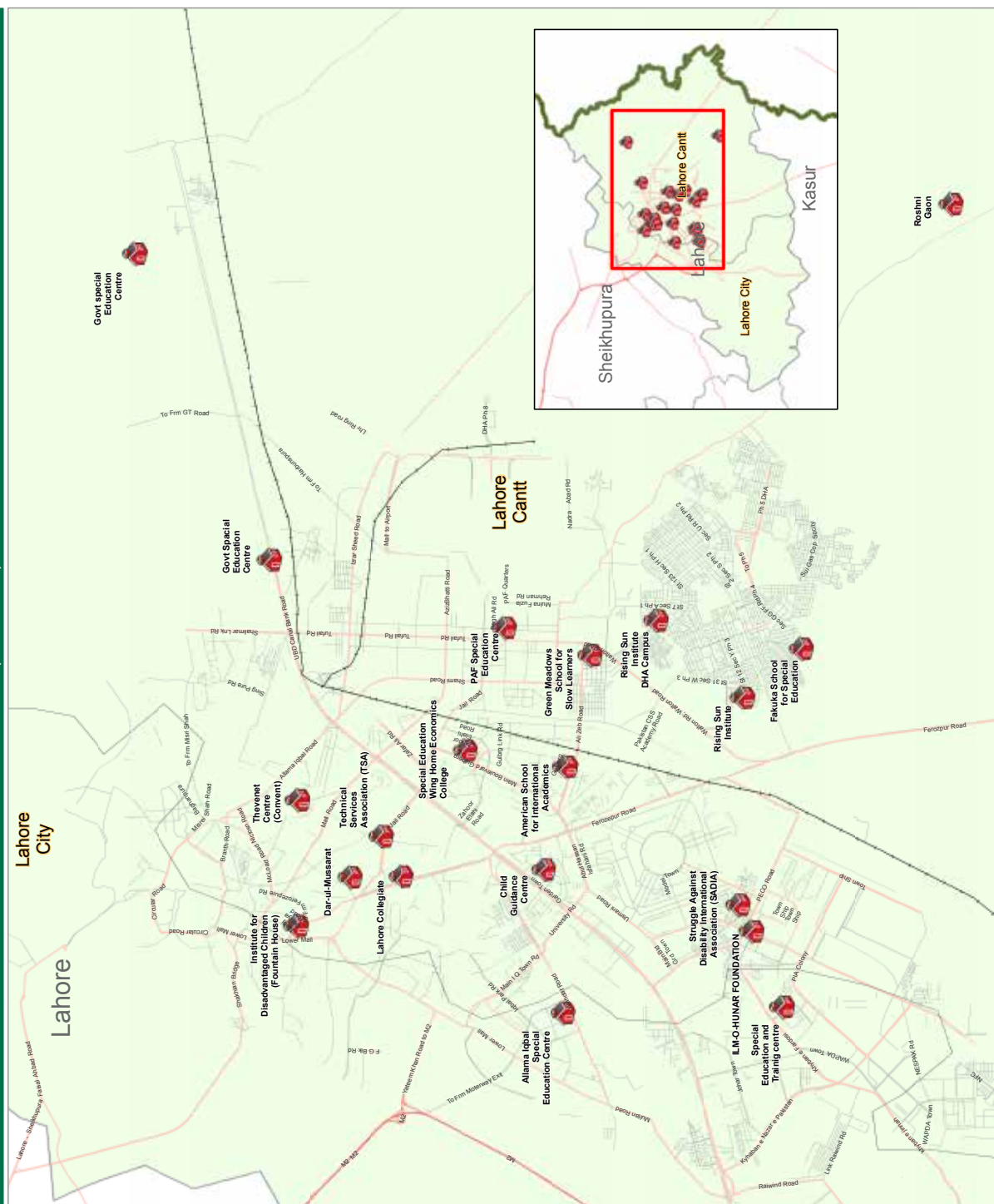
The one light of hope comes from the PML-N. In its manifesto the party declared to protect the autonomy and federal status of the Higher Education Commission. Indeed a number of senior PML-N party members have campaigned to protect the HEC from being destroyed in the past. Meanwhile teachers in Sindh are up in arms against the provincial government for its attempt to intrude into the autonomy of universities by taking away the powers to appoint vice chancellors and senior university officials. The school education system is in tatters in Sindh and now the same will happen to the universities.

There is urgent need for the Supreme Court of Pakistan to take suo motu notice of the contempt committed by the Sindh government by passing a law to form the Sindh HEC, in defiance of the Supreme Court order. The law passed by the Sindh Assembly on February 21, 2013 as well as the notification issued on November 26, 2013 should be considered illegal.

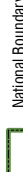
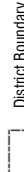
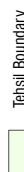
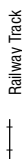
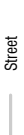
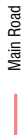
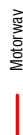
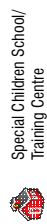
All those responsible for passing this law in open defiance of the Supreme Court decision are in contempt. My petition against this illegal action is pending.

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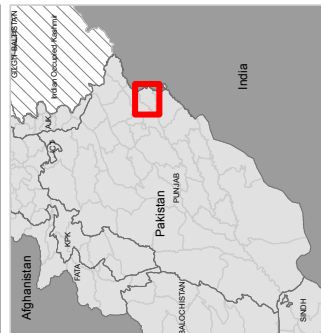

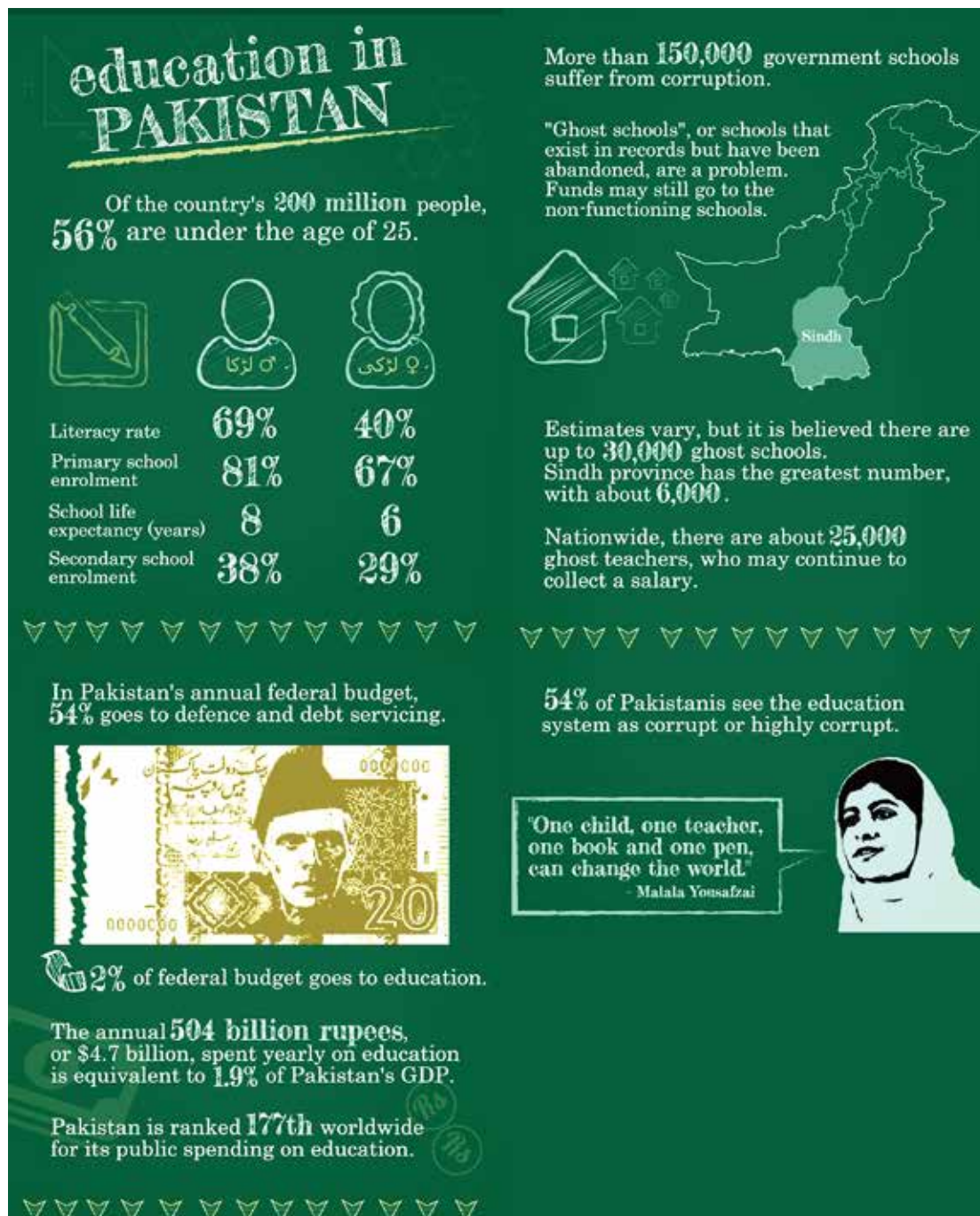

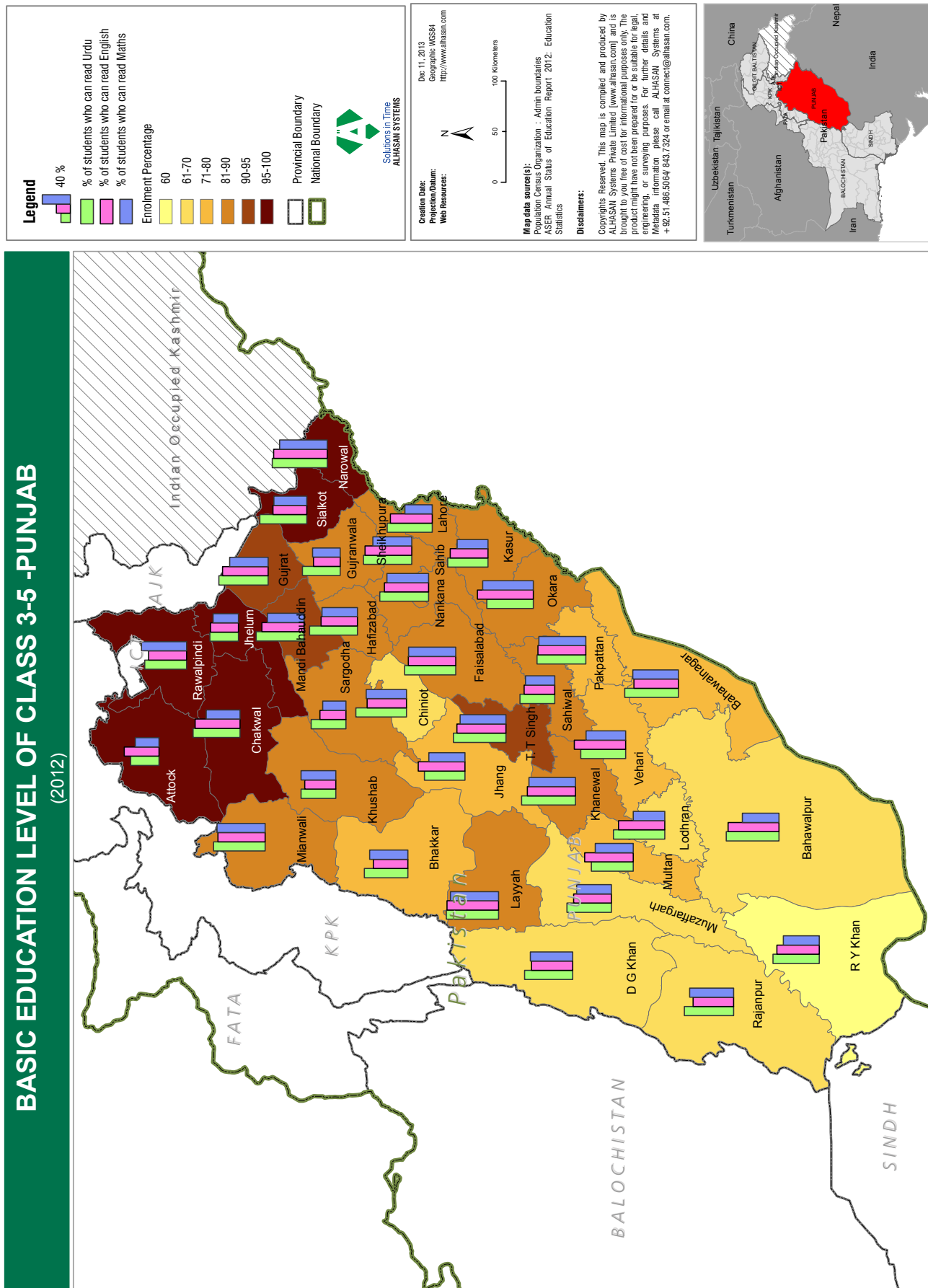
Sixty-nine percent of women and 50 percent of men in Pakistan cannot read or write according to Alif Ailaan (A for announcement), an alliance for education reform leading a communication campaign in the country.

Only 67 percent of Pakistani girls and 81 per cent of boys go to primary school, according to the United Nations. At secondary level, Pakistan's enrollment rate drops to 38 percent for boys – and 29 per cent for girls.

The education campaigners in Pakistan believe, Taliban and militancy is not the only reason behind the lack of good public education system in the country. They believe that Pakistan needs to spend more on education and declare an education emergency.

In the country's 2013-2014 budget, Pakistan set aside 54 percent for defense and repaying loans Education only got 2 percent.

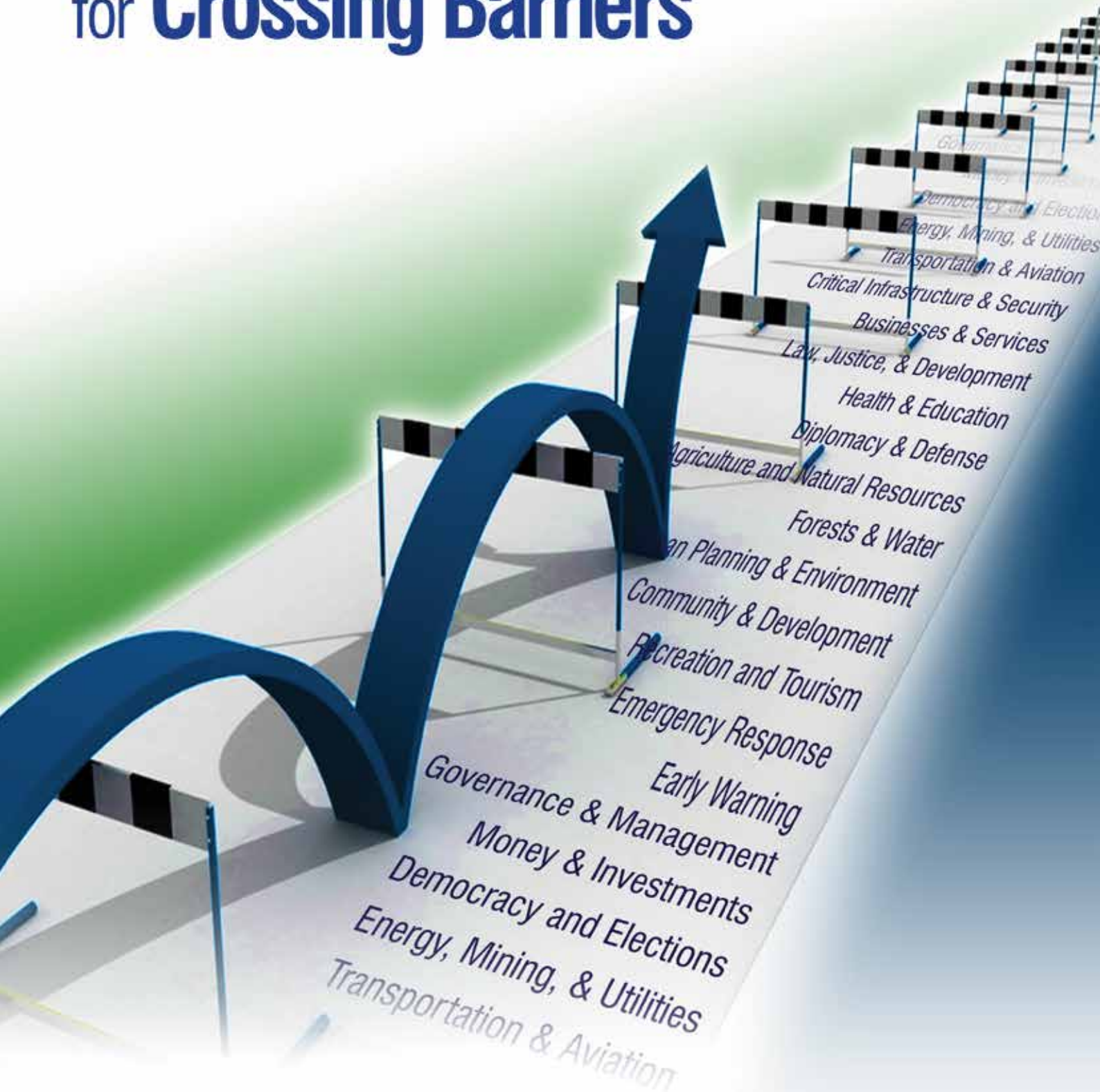
